A: I would suggest you to simply report to this bug which is linked to on the game's website. There is a report form on the bottom of the page. It will result in a notification that is displayed on the top of the screen. If you want to report it as an error, you should go to the Jagex technical support and follow the steps there. A: The issue is that you have several duplicate entries of \$baseurl in your.ini file. The error is telling you that the baseurl is set to \$baseurl_index.php, which is not what you're expecting. You could fix this by doing a find and replace, looking for \$baseurl_index.php and replacing it with \$baseurl. You could also try putting a single line at the top that does this same find and replace for \$baseurl. For example, do this: \$baseurl = \$baseurl_index.php; A: I found out what the problem was. I had about 8 files named index.php in my webroot with the same code. The last one won, because the php interpreter loaded it first, and the rest were overwritten. That is a pretty big list of crash-free games, but I'm in the spot where I'm not sure if I should not even consider playing the games or try and get it to work with my system. The game is relatively new (released about a year ago) and at the time, I didn't even play it, but, now it has become a passion of mine. I've played some indie games, but I'm really not too familiar with the software, but I'm assuming it's not too complicated to fix. So any help or ideas would be appreciated.

A: How long have you been getting the error? It sounds like an overclocked CPU is to blame for the crash. Your CPU should be stable at 2.7-3.0Ghz. The slowest clock of your CPU should be 1.0Ghz. If it is not overclocked then you may be running an emulator or virtual machine in compatibility mode. This is not a fix, it is a troubleshooting technique. If you are not overclocking or running on your CPU at 1.0Ghz, then your mistake was manually selecting compatibility mode. Before you do anything else, uninstall your antivirus software and disable it. Then, you should try restarting your computer and turn off your computer. When it has powered down to a black screen with no BSOD, press the windows key + R to open the run command window. Then, type: Sfc /scannow This will check your system for any malware infections and is a good start to troubleshooting this error. If you haven't had this problem in a while, then it may not be malware. You may have just simply locked up on it, and now you just need to figure out why.
